Special Rules and Regulations for this Department

1. Any officially enrolled 4-H member in good standing during the 4-H club year from October 1, 2008 through September 30, 2009 is eligible to enter. Standing will be confirmed by the Superintendent through your respective County 4-H office. Junior members are 9 - 13 years of age. Senior Members are 14 - 18 years of age. Members ages 5-8 years old and enrolled in 4-H Clover Kids are eligible to exhibit in Division 051, 052 & 053.
2. Use the entry form labeled 4-H Program found at the end of this section. Members must be officially enrolled in project areas related to the division and class you wish to enter. Only one entry per lot is permitted unless otherwise specified. Entry forms must be certified by a Project Leader or a County 4-H Agent.
3. Items exhibited in previous years may not be submitted again. Items exhibited are to be the work of the 4-H member. Items are not required to have been entered or received a rosette or special award at a county fair.
4. If Leaders are bringing exhibits in for their group, be sure each member's exhibit is identified with his/her name, Division and Class numbers.
5. All exhibits must be picked up on release day unless prior arrangements have been made with the Superintendent.
6. School Groups please contact the Superintendent to make any special arrangements for dropping off or picking up entries.

Submit 4-6 uncut cookies, brownies, muffins, and rolls. Foods exhibited must not contain perishable fillings or toppings such as: creams, eggs, custard, meat, vegetable, fresh fruits, etc. Foods requiring refrigeration will not be accepted.

Attach to each food item entered a 3" x 5" card with the name of the food item and the recipe used. School or community center type clubs may submit one recipe card for a whole group.

Photography Section**Special Rules & Regulations:**

Due to the amount of entries received in this division, adherence to the rules is important. Non-compliance may be subject to a lower award given or disqualification.

1. All photos must be part of the member's project learning and must be mounted or framed appropriately. Photos mounted inappropriately may be disqualified.
2. Junior members may enter 4" x 6" prints or enlargements. The photos must be attached to poster or mat board or be framed. Senior members must enter 5" x 7" or 8" x 10" enlargements and they must be window matted or framed.
3. All entries must be labeled on the back with the following: name, age and year in 4-H when photo was taken, type of camera used and printing process used (by self in lab or on computer, print shop, web service, etc.).
4. Digital photos must be printed on photo paper. An explanation of any alterations made should be attached to the back.
5. Exhibitors may enter one black and white photograph and one color photograph per class. Extra entries will be disqualified. Poster exhibits are limited to one per class.
