SPECIAL RULES - READ CAREFULLY

- 1. IMPORTANT: Read carefully all GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS and all HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS in the front of the Exhibitor Handbook.

ENTRIES

- 2. THE DEADLINE for Open Beef entries is September 17. Entries will close sooner if capacity is reached. See General Rules Entry Requirements for additional explanation. Mail entries to Arizona State Fair, Livestock Entry Department, 1826 West McDowell Road, Phoenix, AZ 85007 or enter online.
3. ENTRY FEE: \$10.00 per head for each animal is required and must accompany official entry form. No additional entry fee is required for Group classes, but individual animals must have been shown in individual classes and entry must be shown on the entry form. Late entries may be accepted for 15 days following the deadline by paying an additional late fee of \$10.00 per head. In hardship cases, a formal request to further extend the entry deadline or waive late fees may be filed with the Livestock Director. Such requests will only be granted with the approval of the Livestock Director, Livestock Superintendent and the Department Superintendent.
4. OWNERSHIP: The owner as shown on the entry form must be the bona fide owner of the animals entered and have continuously owned the animals for at least 30 days prior to the opening day of the Fair.
5. Open Beef may be entered by a fitting service, but animals must be entered in the name of the owner. All calves in cow/calf classes or senior yearling classes will be required to be registered with their respective breed association

CHECK-IN

- 6. The original registration certificate will be required at check-in. NO PHOTOCOPIES WILL BE ACCEPTED!
7. SUBSTITUTIONS or Scratches of entries will not be allowed after an exhibitor has checked-in.

STALLS / BEDDING

- 8. First bedding will NOT be provided. Exhibitors will be required to provide bedding. Straw and wood shaving will be available for purchase at the feed store on the grounds, or you may bring your own. Stalls and cattle must be kept clean before and after the judging has been completed and premiums have been awarded.

- 9. The superintendent will have full charge of barns and stalls in the department and will assign cattle with like breeds as close together as is possible for him to do so.

BLOCKING CHUTES / GENERATORS

- 10. Blocking chutes are restricted to designated areas, must be registered with the Livestock Office. It is suggested exhibitors cooperate with one another in utilizing the available blocking chutes.
11. GENERATORS: Absolutely NO GENERATORS will be allowed due to Fire Code Restrictions.

FITTING

- 12. Use of all aerosol products, paint or adhesives will not be permitted.

BREED SHOW

- 13. The Arizona State Fair reserves the right to cancel any breed show if insufficient entries are received. In that event, those animals may change entry to the All Other Breed Show. This option is only available to the following breeds and only they are eligible for the All Other Breeds Show: Angus, Brahman, Brangus, Charolais, Gelbvieh, Hereford, Limousin, Maine Anjou, Piedmontese, Polled Hereford, Red Angus, Salers, Simmental and Shorthorn.
14. Prior to judging, animal tattoos may be checked by breed association representatives to confirm they match the tattoo shown on the entry form.

SHOW RING

- 15. An Entry Number will be assigned to each animal and must be displayed whenever the animal is shown.
16. All animals are to be led from the outside and enter the show ring through the SOUTH door.
17. Bulls more than one year old must be secured by a ring in the nose or otherwise secured to the satisfaction of the superintendent.

RELEASE

- 18. Open Beef Cattle will be released after 8:00 am Monday and must be removed by noon that day. Exhibitors must have a release from the feed and bedding provider before livestock release will be issued by department superintendent.

PASSES, PERMITS AND VEHICLES

- 19. Upon arrival to the fairgrounds, the Open Cattle Office will issue to each exhibitor four daily admission passes, one vehicle parking permit and one trailer parking permit. The Exhibitor must sign for passes and permits. Additional parking passes may be purchased for \$30 each. Space is limited and purchase of a pass does not imply a guarantee of availability.
20. All feed trucks or vehicles must be out of the barn area by 9:30 a.m. each day.

OPEN BEEF CATTLE

DIVISION NO. 1 – ANGUS

- 1. Cattle must be registered with the American Angus Association (3201 Frederick Boulevard, St. Joseph, MO 64501)
2. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible tattoo corresponding to its registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
3. Any female shown with calf at side, calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check in.
4. Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.
5. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.
6. DNA marker or blood type for parentage verification – Under the Association Rules each animal for which entry application (registration) is received, may be subjected to a DNA marker type or blood type test to verify ACCURACY of PARENTAGE as covered under Association Rules. Staff of the American Angus Association must supervise the collection of DNA or blood samples. Animals are often sampled at shows, fairs or events where the American Angus Association contributes premiums or where Association personnel participate.
7. If a recorded parent is excluded (as a parent) as a result of DNA or blood type, the owner may request, at his own expense, the Association to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine the sire and dame disqualifies the animal's eligibility in the Angus herd book, and the registration certificate becomes null and void.
8. All other general and division rules of this Show apply.

GROUP CLASSES

- 49 Get-of-Sire: Four animals shown in above single entry classes with both sexes represented and all to be the progeny of one sire. The exhibitor must own all cattle exhibited in the Get-of-Sire.
50 Junior Get-of-Sire: Three animals shown in above single entry classes both sexes represented all to be the progeny of one sire. The exhibitor must own all cattle exhibited in the Get-of-Sire.
51 Best Six Head: Owned by Exhibitor. All animals must have been shown in their respective single entry classes and they must be owned by the exhibitor or by a member of his immediate family. Animals must have been calved on the exhibitor's farm or ranch and must have been calved the property of exhibitor or the property of a member of his family.

DIVISION NO. 2 - BRAHMAN

- 1. Animals must be registered in the American Brahman Breeders Association (ABBA) to be eligible to compete in Association sponsored shows. The registration certificate (or photocopy) for each entry must be available for presentation to the superintendent or manager of the show at the time entries are verified prior to judging.
2. The registration number and animal identification number (number branded on animal) of each animal entered must be listed on the entry form. The name and registration number of the dam and sire must also be listed on the entry form.
3. Entries not complying with rules 1 and 2 will not be eligible to show, receive premium monies or earn points in the Association's Register of Renown.
4. To be eligible for group classes, animals must be entered and shown in individual classes and must be owned by the exhibitor.

5. Entries will be listed numerically according to age (oldest first) in catalogs and judging schedules. When entering the arena for judging, exhibitors will line up numerically.
6. Judges are allowed to comment on placings in selected classes when conditions permit.
7. Each animal must be presented in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification includes any surgical or circulatory constrictions or other appearance change, except branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Silicone or other injections for cosmetic purposes are prohibited. If ABBA or Arizona Exposition and State Fair Board or their representative suspect an animal's natural conformation or structure has been altered the animal is ineligible to compete until the Superintendent and owner has reviewed the case.
8. In cases where families, companies, corporations, etc., are operated as a unit under the same management, but have cattle also registered in the name of individual partners, said cattle, even though bearing a different ownership brand, are eligible to be shown in competition under the firm name provided they have not been and will not be shown in the name of the individuals.
9. For females being shown in the three oldest classes (females calved September 1, 2007 - August 31, 2008 for Fall Shows; females calved January 1 - December 31, 2008 for Spring shows). Exhibitor must have a certificate of pregnancy issued by a licensed veterinarian available for inspection by the judge on request or a certificate verifying she has produced fertile and viable eggs. The show reserves the right to perform pregnancy determination by palpation for females in the above classes at any given ABBA approved show if an official protest has been filed. Females exhibited in the last two classes at the spring shows MUST have a calf at side. The only exemption from this rule will be cows that have already weaned a calf and a registration certificate of the calf must be presented to the judge.
10. For bulls showing in the oldest class of spring and fall season, exhibitor must have a certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian stating the bull has produced viable semen. This certificate must be available for inspection by the judge on request.
11. The two animals shown in the produce-of-dam class must be natural calves owned by the exhibitor. The two animals shown in the embryo produce class may both be embryo calves or one embryo and one natural calf. The four animals shown together in the get-of-sire class must be from as least two different dams, but all from one sire with both sexes represented and all owned by the exhibitor. All group classes may also be composed of animals owned by more than one breeder if those breeders are co-owners of the sire and dam.
12. No more than one produce-of-dam entry is permitted to show from one dam.
13. Cows exhibited with calves-at-side must be in a lactating stage. Calves must not exceed 240 days of age on day of judging. The ring steward will make the judge aware of those cows whose calves are ineligible to show by this rule.
14. Cattle will be disqualified if their switches have been balled or glitter applied to their skin.
15. Breeders are not eligible to judge cattle owned by their partners if the cattle are sired by or out of cows owned jointly with the judge and exhibitor.
16. Close family relations (mother-daughter, brother-sister, or father-son) are not allowed to judge one another's cattle.
17. All other general and division rules of this Show apply.

**DIVISION NO. 3 - BRANGUS**

1. Animals must be registered with the International Brangus Breeders Association (IBBA) to be eligible to compete. The registration certificate for each entry must be available for inspection when entries are verified prior to judging.
2. The animal's registration number and permanent identification number (tattoo or brand) must be listed on the entry form. The name and registration number of the dam and sire must also be listed on the entry form.
3. Animals to be shown in group classes must also be entered and shown in individual classes.
4. Breeding animal's head must be clipped of all hair and be free of scurs and/or slick spots
5. Any animal with scurs, slick spots or evidence of incisions, surgical or otherwise, in the following areas: head, testicles, sheath, navel or dewlap, will be disqualified.
6. No animal may be shown that has had foreign objects glued or otherwise attached that alters its conformation or changes its appearance. Tails ties and hairnets used on the tail are the only exception.
7. All Brangus bulls 15 months of age or older, exhibited at IBBA sponsored shows, must have passed a fertility examination given by a licensed veterinarian to be eligible to show. The results of the examination should be sent to IBBA and will be kept on file. Once a bull has a positive examination on file with IBBA, he does not need to be tested again.
8. Exhibitors not complying with all rules are not eligible to show, receive premium monies or earn points in the association's Sire of the Year award, Show Bull and Show Heifer of the Year awards.
9. All IBBA members (regular or junior) will abide by the show rules as adopted. In addition any show, fair, event or display in which Brangus cattle participate should comply with these rules adopted by IBBA.
10. All Brangus entries are subject to the IBBA rule entitled "Inspection of Exhibits".

**DIVISION NO. 4 - SHORTHORNS**

1. ALL CATTLE MUST BE PUREBRED TO BE ELIGIBLE TO SHOW  
 Note: In order for a Junior or Senior exhibitor to be eligible to receive the American Shorthorn Associations share of the premiums at American Shorthorn Association supported Open Shows, the owners entire herd must be enrolled in the Shorthorn Performance Records (SPR) Program and each animal shown must have individual SPR records.
2. No exhibitor shall be permitted to win more than two prizes in any one class.
3. All animals must be registered as the property of the exhibitor in the records of the American Shorthorn Association as of a date prior to the opening of the Fair or show.
4. Individual animals shown in all of the group classes listed below must have been entered and shown in one of the following classes for single animals. Multiple owned animals must be

- exhibited in the name of all owners.
- 5. Family bred and raised animals entered by juniors in Junior Classes and subsequently entered in Open classes may be treated as family entries in-group classes.
- 6. All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are subject to a tattoo inspection by representatives of the Association. All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are also subject to an age inspection if deemed necessary by the American Shorthorn Association and the decision of the examining veterinarian is final. Use of artificial fins on show animals is not permitted.
- 7. All General Rules & Regulations apply. Please read them carefully.
- 8. Entry in this show binds the exhibitor to all regulations pertaining thereto.

GROUP CLASSES

DIVISION NO. 6 – RED ANGUS

- 1. Cattle must be registered with the Red Angus Association of America, 4201 N. I – 35, Denton, Texas 76207-3415, phone (940) 387-3502. Registered Red Angus cattle, including Category 1-A (100%) and Category 1-B (87%-99%) are eligible to show and will be shown together in the same classes.
- 2. Entries in classes at any Red Angus Show are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the rules and regulations of the Red Angus Association of America with reference to inspections of entries, such as blood typing, mousing and such other inspections prescribed by the Red Angus Association.
- 3. The animal's registration number and permanent identification number must be listed on the entry form. The name and registration number of the dam and sire must also be listed on the entry form.
- 4. It is mandatory that the Category and blood percentage be printed as the certificate states on all stall cards, show programs.
- 5. Cattle entered in any Red Angus show must be officially registered in one of the following: Red Angus Association Herdbook, in the Herdbook of the Canadian Angus Association or any foreign Angus Association Herdbook recognized by the Red Angus Association of America.
- 6. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match the registration certificate. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or does not match the registration certificate and cannot be read during processing, it will not be allowed to participate in the show.
- 7. Each exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus cattle entered in any Red Angus show or exhibition is required to ensure that each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure and without any alterations or modifications, with the exception of acceptable fitting, grooming and treatment of hooves.

- 8. The addition of any hair or hair-like substances shall be considered an unethical practice and will not be allowed in Red Angus competition.
- 9. All females 20 months of age or older (on announced date of show) exhibited at a show sponsored by the Red Angus Association of America must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side. Failure to show documentation will result in the animal being ineligible to show.
- 10. All bulls 9 months of age or older (on announced date of show) exhibited at a show sponsored by the Red Angus Association of America must be shown with a nose lead.
- 11. Each entry in a Red Angus show must be made in the name of the owner of record, or a member of the immediate family of the owner of record, appearing on the Registration Certificate.
- 12. Partnership animals must be so registered and entered under the partnership designation.
- 13. Exhibitors must have official Registration or Incomplete Registration Certificates on all entries available for inspection by show and/or Association officials. This may include officially produced copies of original Registration Certificates obtainable from the Red Angus Association National Office.
- 14. Animals entered in any Red Angus show must have been registered in the name of the person entering said animal(s) not less than 30 days prior to the date of judging.
- 15. Each exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus entering in any Red Angus show or exhibition is subject to the following "Declaration of Participation" in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Red Angus Association of America:
  - a. "I/we, as exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus, having made entry application to any Red Angus show or exhibition do hereby agree:
  - b. "To make our cattle available to any tests or examinations called for by designated representatives of the Red Angus Association of America or show officials with regard to acceptability of the cattle to be exhibited in the show.
  - c. "To absolve the Red Angus Association of America from claims for damages resulting from any such examinations or test requested by designated representatives of the Association or show officials.
  - d. "To retain the right to challenge the results of any such examination or test in due course and under the provisions of the Right to Appeal, in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Red Angus Association of America and incorporated in the SHOW REGULATIONS AND CLASSIFICATIONS."
