SPECIAL RULES - READ CAREFULLY

IMPORTANT: Read carefully all **GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS** and all **HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS** in the front of the Exhibitor Handbook. This show is approved by ALSA, Inc. All rules and guidelines for this show will be in accordance with the 13th edition ALSA handbook.

ENTRIES

1. THE DEADLINE for Open Llama entries is **September 24th**. Entries will close sooner if capacity is reached. See General Rules Entry Requirements for additional explanation. Mail entries to Arizona State Fair, Livestock Entry Department, 1826 West McDowell Road, Phoenix, AZ 85007 or enter online.
2. ENTRY FEE: \$8.00 per head for each animal is required, (\$8.00 ASF), including adult showmanship and must accompany official entry form. Youth showmanship entry fee is \$5.00. No additional entry fee is required for Group classes, but individual animals must have been shown in individual classes and entry must be shown on the entry form. Late entries may be accepted for 15 days following the deadline by paying an additional late fee of \$8.00 per head. An additional \$5.00 ALSA fee per head is required at check – in. Exhibitors unable to produce a valid membership card will be charged the \$30.00 Non- ALSA member fee per farm. In hardship cases, a formal request to further extend the entry deadline or waive late fees may be filed with the Livestock Director. Such requests will only be granted with the approval of the Livestock Director, Livestock Superintendent and the Department Superintendent.
3. ANIMALS: Exhibitors must be the registered owners and make entry in the exact names (owner and animal) as shown on the registration certificate. All llamas entered in approved classes must be registered or have passed screening with the international llama registry, (ILR) or the Canadian Livestock Record Corporation (CLRC). If non-breeders are not registered and wish to be in the ALSA award system and wish to show in halter, they must show in the adult non-breeder halter class. All entries must include date of birth.
4. OWNERSHIP: Registration papers or photocopies must be sent with the entry form to show management for verification of name and age. Failure to meet this requirement prohibits entry in the show. A copy of current ALSA membership card should accompany entry form. Non-breeder llamas must

be accompanied by a registration or veterinarian certificate verifying the animal is a gelding, a vasectomized male, or a spayed or non-reproductive female.

5. GROUP CLASSES: Nursing llama mothers may not be accompanied in the ring by their babies. ALSA recommends not show nursing mothers. Llamas may not be moved from one class to another after halter judging has begun, except at the judge's decision.
6. SHOWMANSHIP: Adult showmanship fee is \$8.00. Youth showmanship fee is \$5.00. Youth divisions are as follows: Junior, 8-11 years; Intermediate, 12-14 years; Senior, 15-18 years.

PENS / BEDDING / BARN

7. First bedding will NOT be provided. Exhibitors will be required to provide bedding. Straw and wood shaving will be available for purchase at the feed store on the fairgrounds, or you may bring your own. Pens and animals must be kept clean before and after the judging has been completed and premiums have been awarded.
8. The superintendent will have exclusive jurisdiction as to how many animals to a pen and assignment of pens.
9. NO DOGS or other pets are allowed in this department.

CHECK-IN

10. Registration papers must be checked by the clerk prior to the posted check-in deadline.
11. Health certificates are to be left in the Llama office, to be returned upon departure.
12. SUBSTITUTIONS or Scratches of entries must be made at Check-In and will not be allowed after Check-In. No Exceptions will be made.
13. Any exhibitor having an animal that will not be shown must notify the superintendent before the class is called.

PASSES, PERMITS AND VEHICLES

14. Upon arrival to the fairgrounds, the Llama Barn Livestock Office will issue four daily admission passes, one vehicle parking pass and one trailer parking permit, which must be signed for by the Exhibitor. Additional parking passes may be purchased for \$30 each. Space is limited and purchase of a pass does not imply a guarantee of availability. All vehicles must be out of barn area by 9:30 am each morning.

RELEASE

15. Open Llamas will be released after 10:00 pm Sunday and must be removed by noon the following day. Exhibitors must have a release from the feed and bedding provider before livestock release will be issued by department superintendent.

OPEN PERFORMANCE

Obstacle: The purpose of the Obstacle Class is to demonstrate the well-trained animal's obedience and willingness to complete the activities requested by the handler.

Llamas may show in only one performance division – novice or advanced. Novice classes are

open to all entries that have won fewer than three (3) ribbons for first, second or third in Open, or Novice division of the respective ALSA Approved class. Advanced classes are open to all entries who have previously placed first, second or third in the Open, Advanced or Novice division of the respective ALSA approved classes. No llama may be entered in more than one obstacle class, nor entered in any obstacle class more than once. Exhibitor will be allowed only 2 misses or balks and then will be automatically disqualified and asked to leave the ring.

Pack: This class is designed to present or simulate the conditions and obstacles actually encountered when packing llamas on the trail. All exhibitors must provide their own saddle and panniers. The handler shall wear clothing, including footwear, suitable for packing.

Novice classes are open to animals 18-36 months of age and must carry a pack system or training pack with two cinches, complete with fill material to simulate a full pack loaded for an actual packing trip. It is not required that the panniers be removable. These llamas must not carry measurable weight beyond negligible fill materials in their packs. All exhibitors must provide their own saddle and panniers, or training pack. Advanced classes are open to animals over 37 months of age and must carry a pack system with two cinches with a minimum of 40 lbs. The system is required to have removable panniers. Advanced exhibitors are responsible for having their panniers weighed and noted.

Public Relations: This class is for the animal who participate in community activities, goes to schools, hospitals, service clubs, parades, charity functions, children's homes, rehabilitation therapy with a variety of patients, TV or other media appearances for promotion.

The animal will be shown in a clean, well-fitted halter and lead. Novice division competes in 8 obstacles. Advanced division competes in 10 obstacles. Mandatory obstacles include stairs or ramps, confinement area pick-up foot and show pad or show teeth, loading in vehicle, backing around or between obstacles and petting. The public relations course must differ from the Obstacle course by at least 4 obstacles.

All llamas must be entered in a minimum of two approved performance classes, one of which must be Advanced Obstacle. Approved performance classes are Novice and Advanced Public Relations, Novice and Advanced Pack and Novice and Advanced Obstacle. Points will be awarded according to the ALSA point chart.
