SPECIAL RULES – READ CAREFULLY

IMPORTANT: Read carefully all **GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS, YOUTH DIVISIONS RULES AND REGULATIONS** and all **HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS**.

1. THE DEADLINE for Youth Dairy Goat entries is **September 1**. Entries will close sooner if capacity is reached. See General Rules Entry Requirements for additional explanation. Enter online or mail entries to Arizona State Fair, Livestock Entry Department, 1826 West McDowell Road, Phoenix, AZ 85007.
2. ENTRY FEE: \$5.00 per head for each animal is required and must accompany official entry form.
3. Animals must be clean and ready for the show ring at time of check-in.
4. First bedding will NOT be provided but will be available for purchase at the feed store, or you may bring your own.
5. Exhibitors must have a release from the feed and bedding provider before livestock release will be issued by department superintendent. The department superintendent will assign a release time for each exhibitor to control the flow of traffic onto the fairgrounds and into the barn areas. All vehicles must be removed from the barn areas prior to 9:30 am each day.
6. Muzzles made with mesh material may be used on an animal ONLY if the animal is bedded on shavings or straw, no synthetic materials (carpet) are used for bedding AND the exhibitor creates an educational poster about the proper use of Muzzles and displays the poster on the animal's pen. This is in addition to any posters entered as a Special Exhibit.
7. Stalls/Pens, wash racks and aisles must be kept clean at all times. A stall card displaying exhibitor's name, animal's name and club, chapter or organization must be posted on animal's stall or pen.

A \$25.00 award will be provided for an outstanding individual exhibit and outstanding club/chapter project. No entry is required, BUT must check the exhibit in with the department Superintendent and identify the project as a Club/Chapter Project or an Individual Project.
